Alan Hulsizer enters the Pennsylvania State Bowling Association Hall of Fame for his outstanding achievements in the game of bowling.

Alan has bowled in 26 PSBA tournaments and 26 USBC (formerly ABC) tournaments. He has over one-thousand 700 series, forty-four 300's and sixteen 800's to his credit in 36 years of organized bowling.

As a member of the Coors Light team he helped to win the PSBA Championship five times. Alan is a four-time Berks County Amateur Champion, has five Reading BA team titles and made the 1st team Reading BA All-Star team 14 times. He also has ten Lebanon Dutchman titles, two 700 Grand Champion titles, two Over 40 High Roller Sweeper titles in Las Vegas, a Bowlers Journal National Doubles title with Pat Healey and was a member of the ABC Championship Team of 1992 in Corpus Christi, Texas.

Alan has finished in the top 100 at the National Tournament 10 times, an ABC Masters finalist three times, a four-time ABC World Team Challenge Tournament finalist, a seven-time Super Hoinke finalist and a four-time Lilac Tournament finalist.

Alan's accomplishments in bowling are many, and we have only touched on some of them.

Robert Schnepf Sr. enters the Pennsylvania State Bowling Association Hall of Fame for his meritorious service to the game of bowling.

Bob is a life member of the Bucks County USBC Association and was inducted into the Bucks County Bowling Hall of Fame in 1994. He has been involved in organized bowling for 43 years, has served as a league officer and held many local and state offices. He managed the Minors event house during the 1983 PSBA tournament and was the coordinator for the 1995 Championship tournament.

On the state level, Bob served on many of the PSBA committees including the Sergeant of Arms committee. He served as an Eastern Area Director before being elected PSBA 4th Vice President. Bob served as the PSBA President during the 1997-1998 season and has served on the Advisory Board since 1998. During Bob's service as a PSBA Line Officer, the PA State Bowling Council was formed and Bob was elected to serve as the first Council President.

Bob has bowled in 28 PSBA Tournaments and 18 ABC / USBC Tournaments.
